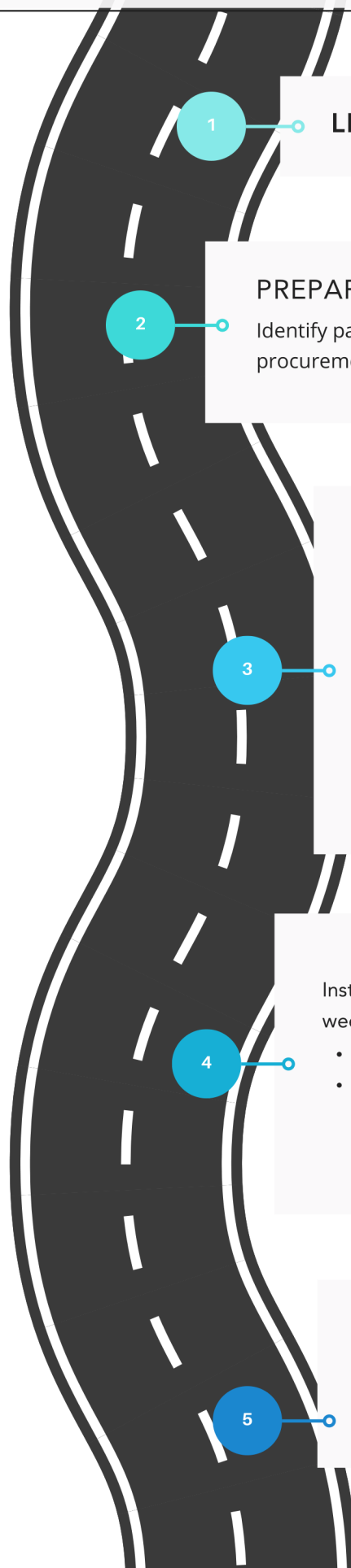




The process of installing the equipment only takes 1-2 weeks per building, but there may be some additional things for the shelters, City or State agencies and/or nonprofit partners to consider throughout the commissioning process:

- Educating decision-makers and service providers about GUV's effectiveness and safety
- Working within existing rules to use domestic vendors who are pre-qualified for Federal contracts and can provide comprehensive support throughout the process and beyond
- Working together to secure funding and needed approvals at various points throughout the process
- Managing a multi-site assessment process, including contracting and coordinating with local electrician(s) as needed during installation
- Providing training and support to facilities staff and clients, and reinforcing knowledge and optimizing uptake of additional infection control measures
- Working together to secure funding for equipment replacement and re-inspection to ensure a sustainable solution



1 LEARN

2 PREPARE
Identify partners, funding, procurement mechanism(s), etc.

3 FINALIZE
Onsite meetings to:

- Measure spaces and finalize cost and project timelines
- Execute contracts with final Scope of Work
- Build installation timeline and coordinate with/educate facilities staff and other partners on the process

4 INSTALL
Install equipment (usually 1-2 weeks per building):

- Conduct initial safety testing
- Educate participants and staff (re: new equipment and infectious disease mitigation)

5 MAINTAIN
Service visits to test and potentially replace aged equipment are needed every 6 or 12 months.
